Next week and beyond...

Wednesday 5th March – Ash Wednesday (Start of lent)

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent, a 40-day period of fasting, repentance, and spiritual preparation leading up to Easter.

During our Ash Wednesday service, students and staff will have the opportunity to receive the ashes from a staff Eucharistic minister. The minister applies the ashes in the shape of a cross on the foreheads of worshippers, often while reciting words from scripture. The ashes, typically made from the burned palm branches of the previous year's Palm Sunday, symbolize grief over sin, humility before God, and the hope found in Christ's sacrifice on the cross.

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent, a season reflecting on Jesus' 40-day fast and temptation in the wildness. Throughout Lent, as a school, we will be undertaking a range of fundraising activities in which students and families can support. The proceeds of this fundraising will be given to CAFOD and the Good Shepherd Appeal, our two chosen charities. Monday 3rd March and Monday 10th March – Year 7 outreach days at Read school
